

 - o Note that Chris has advised that the ability to proceed with the programme is wholly reliant upon the Foundation receiving DGR status. Once this has been confirmed, we will proceed with briefing Government on the options to fund the Programme.
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- The Foundation is also engaged in productive discussions with the Office of the Official Secretary to the Governor-General to secure the Governor-General's patronage.

The Programme

- The Programme is a leadership development opportunity for emerging leaders from both government and non-government sectors (e.g. academia, non-profit, corporate etc.).
- It will initially be open to between 140 and 280 participants offering online and face-to-face learning events, study tours, mentoring and coaching, and alumni networking opportunities.
- The Programme will be implemented over a period of two years for each cohort (e.g. cohorts one and two are proposed to participate between 2021 and 2024). The curriculum and format of the Programme is currently under active development with interested multisector parties and other potential (non-government) funders.
- Overall, the Programme's objective is to develop a group of multi-sector leaders who are better connected and impactful, and who jointly share a commitment to the future of Australia, its values and national interest.

The Finance and Public Administration Committee has continued this afternoon. The following is a summary of discussion with the **Department of the Prime Minister & Cabinet** from 2:30 to 3:30pm.



Senator Ayres queried p155 budget paper measure #2 (Australian Future Leaders Program) including the development mid-career leavers and establishment of an alumni network office and has been developed in conjunction with the office of the Official Secretary of the Governor-General. PM&C advised that it is modelled on similar Commonwealth leaders' forums in Canada and India and is targeting business and government to ensure that the right levels of mentoring for med-career leaders. The alumni relates to the network established once the program is completed by participants. Senator Ayres asked if the program has an office or a phone number and how it proposes to bring together mid-career leaders and why it costs \$18m. Minister Birmingham advised that the program is budgeted for five years and will be similar to a program run by the South Australian Government across private and public sectors and to set up networks. The funds will be sit within PM&C but will be administered outside of PM&C. PM&C advised that they are negotiating with the Australian Future Leaders Foundation Ltd to administer the program. Senator Ayres queried whether the Foundation was established for this purpose and whether due diligence was conducted and questioned its DGR status. PM&C advised that the proposal was done in conjunction with the Office of the Official Secretary of the Governor General. Senator Ayres queried whether the APSC had been consulted or were involved in the development of the proposal. Minister Birmingham advised that the source of the funding request is from the Governor General's office.
