### Date: Tuesday, 4 March 2025

The APS Consultative Committee met on Tuesday, 4 March 2025. The following matters were discussed.

#### State of the Service Roadshows

Anna Ryan, Executive Director, Engagement and Communications Branch, Australian Public Service Commission provided an update on the 2025 <u>State of the Service Roadshows</u> which were held in Melbourne, Adelaide and virtually.

#### **APS Specialist Capability**

ACC members discussed the role of specialists in the APS with a focus on current and enduring capability gaps across the service. Discussion highlighted the important role of evidence bases in understanding key issues underpinning specialist capability. Members agreed that specialist capability ought to be fostered at all levels and classifications, given the demonstrated value of specialist leadership.

ACC members discussed 'specialists' work that is currently being undertaken at the Australian Public Service Commission via the <u>APS Data</u>, <u>Digital and Cyber Workforce Plan</u> and the <u>APS Workforce Strategy 2025</u>.

ACC members expressed interest in standing up a Specialists Reference Group as a sub-committee to the ACC to ensure substantive conversations on specialists continue in earnest.

#### Next Meeting

The next meeting of the ACC is scheduled for Tuesday, 17 June 2025.
