Further details about the collection of your personal information are provided below.

Who is collecting your personal information?	Your personal information is being collected by the Australian Public Service Commission (the Commission). The Commission's contact details are: privacy@aspc.gov.au
	The APSC requires all contracted third-party providers to comply with the <i>Privacy Act 1988</i> (the Act), and not do anything, which is done by the Commission, which would breach the Australian Privacy Principles in the Act.
Collection of your personal information	The Commission collects your personal information directly from you, your manager(s), your supervisor(s) and your peers (colleagues at the same employment level that have been identified by the participant as someone they have worked closely with). This may include personal information collected from your annual performance management reviews, 360-degree feedback leadership assessment, and APS census results. On a voluntary basis, the Commission may conduct interviews during the evalution process and collect your personal information during the interview.
Authority for collection of personal information	The Australian Public Service Commissioner has several functions relating to the Australian Public Service authority of collection of personal information. These are stated under sections 41(1) and 41(2) and 44 of the <i>Public Service Act 1999</i> and <i>the Australian Public Service Commissioner's Directions 2013</i> . Under this authority, the APSC is collecting your personal information to foster, and contribute to, leadership, high quality learning and development and career management in the APS (paragraph 41(2)(a) of the Act).
Why does the Commission collect your personal information?	The Commission collects your personal information to administer and evaluate the SES Leadership Programs. Your personal information is used to: • Assess the long-term value SES Leadership Programs have on participants. • Qualify your individual and senior executive service performance improvement impacts. • Identify opportunities for program improvement to ensure program quality and appropriateness over time.
